COI has offices in Jamestown and Dunkirk and employs over 200 individuals.

Due to the growth of COI's Housing and Community Development (HCD) services, the agency has structured these services into two divisions. Amanda Straight, who has served as the Deputy Director of HCD since 2020, now leads the newly created division of Home, Business and Asset Development (HBAD). Services under her leadership include the Weatherization Assistance Program, Lead Hazard Remediation, Homebuyer Education, Foreclosure Prevention, and Credit/Bankruptcy Counseling. Responsibilities for the activities of the agency's affiliate organization, Chautauqua Opportunities for Development, Inc. (CODI) will transfer to Amanda later this year. CODI provides technical assistance and loans to small businesses and startups.

Amanda has been with COI since 2012, holding front-line positions for two years before moving into her first of three management positions in the agency's Housing and Community Development division. She was promoted to Deputy Director of the HCD division in 2020.

Amanda holds a bachelor's degree in social work from SUNY at Fredonia. She has completed the Emerging Leaders Institute sponsored by the NY State Community Action Association and is currently working toward certification as a Community Action Professional, as well as an Implementer of ROMA (Results Oriented Management Accountability). "I am truly grateful for the opportunities COI has given me over the past twelve and a half years," Amanda stated. "In each position I have held, I have learned invaluable skills that have helped me grow both personally and professionally. I am excited to continue to learn and contribute in my new role as Director of Home, Business and Asset Development."

COI's Chief Executive Officer Diane Hewitt Johnson stated, "Amanda Straight has worked at COI for over 12 years, and I've had the pleasure of watching her grow into the leader she is today. She is extremely motivated to learn and grow and is dedicated to making a difference in others' lives. COI's housing services to prevent and respond to homelessness will continue to be provided under the umbrella of a newly named Housing and Emergency Services division. Josiah Lamp, who has led the HCD division since 2016, will continue to oversee these services, which include rental assistance programming, emergency shelter, and affordable housing.



Home Appliance Loan Program Helps with New Oven

Nicole Rothwell, a single mother of three children residing in Dunkirk, NY, recently benefited from Chautauqua Opportunities for Development Inc.'s (CODI) Home Appliance Loan Program. Right before the holidays, Nicole's oven broke. Under the terms of her apartment lease, she was responsible for replacing the appliance herself.

Having previously worked with Chautauqua Opportunities, Inc. (COI), Nicole was familiar with the organization and its programs. She reached out to COI's Navigators, who promptly connected her with the Business Development Specialist. Nicole was provided with the loan application, which she completed and submitted. Her application was processed and approved in a timely manner.

To accommodate Nicole's schedule, CODI's Business Development Specialist collaborated with the organization's Senior Accounting Manager to arrange for her loan closing paperwork to be completed in Dunkirk during her lunch break. Within a day of her loan approval, Nicole met with the Senior Accounting Manager to finalize the closing documents.

Following the completion of her paperwork, CODI's Senior Accounting Manager facilitated payment to the appliance store on Nicole's behalf. The store promptly contacted Nicole to arrange for the delivery of her new oven.

Nicole is pleased with her new appliance and has taken steps to ensure her loan payments are managed responsibly. She opened her first checking account and set up automatic payments, demonstrating her commitment to building a positive credit history by making on-time payments.






Faces of Energy Efficiency

Asset Development Assists with Preventing Foreclosure



In December, a single mother came to COI in a difficult financial situation. The restaurant where she had worked full-time for years saw a decrease in business, which led to her hours being cut to part-time. Her mortgage payment was no longer affordable, and she was now over \$1,500 behind. She had made several attempts to contact her lender, Rocket Mortgage, to see what options were available to her. Working with a lender that has no physical location is often very difficult, and she expressed frustrations getting in contact with the right person over the phone.

During her appointment, a comprehensive budget was completed that showed a monthly deficit. She was unaware that with her new income level, she was eligible for certain programs such as SNAP food assistance. The Asset Development Specialist assisted her with this application online. Her worker provided her with other referral information, such as local food and pet pantries. They also reviewed her resume and looked at different employment options where she could apply to increase her income.

The next step of the appointment was to reach out to Rocket Mortgage to determine what solutions were available. Once connected with the correct department, the Asset Development Specialist was able to explain the customers' financial situation. The lender agreed to suspend the foreclosure, grant a 3-month forbearance, and provide correct contact information so that the customer could easily contact their department to provide updates and potentially extend the forbearance period if needed. This 3-month grace period would allow the customer to focus her time on finding gainful employment.

One week after her appointment, the customer reached out to her worker to let her know that she had three interviews scheduled, all with full time hours and benefits.
